END POINT ASSESSMENT (EPA) REQUIREMENTS

OBSERVATION WITH QUESTIONS

- The observation with questions will take I hour and 20 minutes.
- The total time for the observation element is 50 minutes. The time allocated for questioning is 30 minutes. The
 independent assessor must ask at least 5 questions. Follow-up questions are allowed where clarification is
 required.
- Apprentices must provide the independent assessor with a teaching information pack to provide context for the apprentice's observation at least five days before the observation with questioning.
- The independent assessor should observe the following during the observation:
- Interaction with children and other adults.
- Support of children's learning through facilitating learning opportunities.
- The observed session should form part of a normal working day for the apprentice, and should reflect their typical working practice.

PROFESSIONAL DISCUSSION UNDERPINNED BY PORTFOLIO OF EVIDENCE

- · Portfolio submission must include:
 - Portfolio will typically consist of 12 pieces of evidence.
 - Evidence must be mapped against the KSBs being assessed by the professional discussion.
 - Evidence must relate to 'real' work completed; evidence from simulated activities is not allowed.
- The portfolio of evidence will not be formally assessed, it will be used by the independent assessor to inform the professional discussion.
- The professional discussion will be a 1-to-1 conversation between the independent assessor and apprentice, underpinned by the portfolio which will be available during the discussion.
- The professional discussion will last for a minimum of 90 minutes.
- A minimum of 10 questions will be asked during the discussion to assess depth of understanding, skills, and behaviours.
